(ICAP) Frequently Asked Questions



What is apprenticeship?

Apprenticeship is work based learning. You are an employee with work responsibilities but you also have the added responsibility to build your skill set while on the job. The company has formalized education and skill building agenda. At the end of the apprenticeship the apprentice will receive their Journeyman's certificate identifying them as a certified Cybersecurity professional.

What is the difference between Internship and Apprenticeship?

Many internships are not paid. Few of them have skill building requirements and none of them have a credential at the end.

What are the steps in Apprenticeship? Each registered apprenticeship is different. ICAP has 3 major steps, 1) foundational education 2) Interview and work prep 3)work based learning which includes advanced certifications.

Do I get paid during pre-apprenticeship? NO

Where do I attend class? All classes are virtual

Do I have to quit my job to attend class? NO

How long does it take? All classes are competency based so you proceed at your own pace. That being said, each course should take you no longer than 12 weeks to complete.

Is this a full time or part time program? Phases 1 and 2 can be done part time. Phase 3 is full time paid employment.

Where are the courses taught? All classes are virtual

Why your program instead of others? Our program is designed to lead to employment. It is taught by seasoned professionals, It has a track record of success.

Can I self-pay? Yes

What kind of employment do you guarantee? Nothing is guaranteed. But if you do what is required you have a very good chance at an interview and potentially an employment opportunity.

What forms of payment are accepted? Check, credit card, debit card
